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CIRCULAR

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We would like to bring to the attention of parents that a few students are indulging in the gross misuse of the e-learning facilities provided by the school. In the light of the above subject, we have noted the following serious violations by some students.

1. Photographing and video-graphing of the live classes or assembly.
2. Trolling by posting of disrespectful comments and addition of distasteful music to such photos or videos.
3. Circulation of such photos or videos on social media platforms like Instagram, Facebook, Snapchat, WhatsApp etc.
4. Entering their own and other classes with fake names and bringing about disruption by creating noise, annotating the shared contents with gibberish, passing unnecessary comments by chat etc.
5. Passing the teachers' Ids and passwords to others and prompting them to disturb the online classes.

We have arranged Zoom settings in such a way that only students of the school can enter the virtual classrooms with official email Ids and passwords. Therefore, any disruption of classes is only by students of the school and not outsiders.

LET IT BE BROUGHT TO THE NOTICE OF SUCH MISCREANTS THAT EVERY TINY DETAIL ABOUT THEIR MISBEHAVIOUR CAN BE MONITORED BY US THROUGH ZOOM REPORTS. SEVERE ACTION WILL BE INITIATED AGAINST SUCH STUDENTS, INCLUDING DEBARRING FROM ONLINE CLASSES, TERMINATION FROM THE SCHOOL, OR PROCEEDING WITH LEGAL ACTION WITH THE CYBER CELL OF THE MINISTRY OF INTERIOR, DEPENDING ON THE SEVERITY OF MISBEHAVIOUR.

Also, please note that the students are expected to keep their videos on during classes, unless otherwise instructed by teachers not to. This is to make certain that students, especially those not being monitored by parents at home, are actually attending the classes. If the student is unable to turn his/her video on, the parent is requested to send an email to the school mentioning the reason for the inability to do so. Leaving the video on during the class also helps to make the class more interactive and livelier.

Besides the above deviant behaviour of students, we also would like parents to monitor the learning efforts of their children. We request parents to play a positive role in this new method of learning where our teachers and administrators are taking maximum effort to provide real-time methods of teaching.
